Program Overview 2022 - 2024



Our vision is to make child health and wellbeing a priority for everyone, so all children can focus on what they do best: playing, learning and growing now and in the future.

Priority areas

- Children are confident, capable and cherished: We value play, learning, growth and a keen sense of belonging.
- Parents/caregivers are skilled, resourced and supported: We value our children and their childhood and focus on positively parenting so they can thrive.
- Our community is strong and supportive: We value working in cohesive ways where we include, connect and collaborate to make us stronger together.
- Our community is child friendly and we value children and childhood.

Communities for Children Facilitating Partner (CfC FP) is a place-based program funded by the Department of Social Services until June 2026. CfC FP develops and facilitates a whole of community approach to support and enhance early childhood development and wellbeing for children from pre-birth to 12 years.

The Smith Family has been the CfC FP in the Kwinana Local Government Area since 2005. CfC FP Kwinana works with local organisations to deliver early intervention and prevention activities, build community and sector capacity and strengthen service connections to improve outcomes for children and their families. Within this role, the Facilitating Partner contracts Community Partner Organisations to deliver services to address priority needs of children and families. Funding allocation for this direct service delivery was informed by the CfC FP Community Strategic Plan 2022 – 2026, which was developed through the extensive engagement of local stakeholders.

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Community Partners are funded to deliver services within the Kwinana Cfc FP site for children from pre-birth to 12 years and their families.

The City of Kwinana, located in the traditional lands of the Noongar people, is set amongst native bushland and bordered by a coastal strip of white beaches and heavy industry, south of Perth, Western Australia. Kwinana has a population of over 45,000 people and is the second fastest growing local government area in Western Australia with the population predicted to grow to around 75,000 people by 2031. The population in Kwinana is made up of residents from more than 50 different countries with one in three residents born overseas. Kwinana also has a rich Aboriginal heritage with 4.4% of Kwinana's community identifying as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander – higher than the Perth average of 1%.

Despite the City of Kwinana being the statistically most disadvantaged population in the Perth Metropolitan area, economically Kwinana is known as a hyper-growth region and is part of the National Growth Areas Alliance which represents the fastest growing communities in Australia.

ATTACH: PARENTS UNDER PRESSURE

Attach and its core program, Parents Under Pressure, is an in-home counselling and support service for families who may be struggling with the challenges of parenting whilst coping with issues such as mental illness, substance misuse, family violence, financial stress, social isolation or family relationship difficulties. Delivered by trained practitioners, for a period up to six months, this flexible, practical and individually tailored program is designed to build on existing strengths and support and enhance the carer/parent-child relationship to promote a nurturing environment.

Baby Program

The Incredible Years® Baby Program is a 10-week group program for young parents (under 25 years) with a baby under 12 months of age or young parents expecting a baby within 3 months of the program end. This program is designed to strengthen parenting skills and promote babies social and emotional development. Trained facilitators use video clips to guide the sessions, support open group discussion and enhance problem solving and parenting practices that work towards parent goals.

Toddler Program

Incredible Years® Toddler Program is a 13-week group program for young parents (under 25 years) with children aged between 1 to 3 years old. This program supports parents to encourage their child's language, social and emotional development, manage separation, develop and implement routines

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and use positive discipline. Trained facilitators use video clips of real-life situations to support the training and encourage open group discussions, problem solving and parenting practices that work towards parent goals.

PARENTS LEARNING, PARENTS TEACHING

Parents learning, Parents Teaching combines 2 programs, Parents as Teachers and Empowering Parents, Empowering Communities, which focus on supporting children within their family unit, whilst strengthening and building the families connection to services and supports.

Parents As Teachers

Parents as Teachers (PAT) engages parents and caregivers in supporting the early development,

learning and health of their children (0- 3years of age). PAT is delivered in the home, by trained facilitators over a series of 8 sessions. The sessions are customised and centered on play, offering activities that increase the parent/caregivers knowledge of age appropriate child development and awareness of factors that support their children to be secure, valued and fully participate in play, learning and community life.

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Empowering Parents, Empowering Communities Being A Parent

Being a Parent (BAP) is a 9 week peer-led group program for parents/caregivers, with children aged between 2 – 11 years, to enhance their communication and parenting skills, understand and help their children manage their feelings and gain confidence in areas such as play, listening, discipline strategies and setting boundaries. Parents who attend this program have the opportunity to attend Parent Facilitator training to learn the skills and knowledge to deliver the Being a Parent program.

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Empowering Parents, Empowering Communities

Baby and Us

Baby and Us is a 9 week peer-led group program for parents/careers of babies 0 - 9 months of age. Parents attend with their babies and through group discussions

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and practical activities are supported to understand their baby's cues, cope with challenges around feeding, sleep and crying, build positive interactions and manage parental stress.

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YOUNG ACHIEVERS CLUB

The Young Achievers Club (YAC) is a culturally secure support program for primary schools that uses a strengths perspective to improve educational outcomes, health and wellbeing and cultural connections for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island students in Years 3 to 6. YAC is designed as an in-curriculum weekly program supporting and mentoring YAC students to develop their connection to culture, leadership and personal development through cultural, sporting and leadership activities. Broader school-based cultural engagement opportunities are also offered through cultural celebrations, carnivals, assemblies and specific learning and development opportunities for staff. An extension of this program is an annual transition to high school initiative and a YAC Alumni offering biannual support to Year 6 students to aid in their smooth transition to high school.
