The Factsheet may also be a useful reference tool for employers to broaden their understanding of the skills frameworks used in the Education and Training sectors.

In Australia, there are a number of frameworks that address general capabilities/non-technical skills:

- Employability Skills Framework used in the Vocational Education and Training sector.
- Employability Skills for the Future report. Developed by The Business Council of Australia (BCA) and the Australian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ACCI), in consultation with other peak employer bodies
- Graduate Attributes developed by universities.
- Core Skills for Work Developmental Framework (CSfW) describes the core non-technical skills that have been identified by Australian employers as important for successful participation in work. (August 2013)
- The Australian Blueprint for Career Development, which addresses career management competencies considered essential for lifelong learning.
- The Australian Qualifications Framework, which spans all education and training sectors, also refers to four broad categories of Generic Skills
- The Overarching Outcomes, WA Curriculum Framework
- General Capabilities that form part of the new Australian Curriculum for schools.
