# Digital Divide



- Mostly effects those on low levels of income, education and employment
  - The Australian Digital Inclusion Index Report 2018 says people in the lowest household income quintile have a digital inclusion score of 41.3 which is 30.8 points lower than those in the highest household income quintile (72.1)
- Digital access for disadvantaged students

# What if ?

- You only have access to a smart phone to do homework on?
- there is one computer at home with 3 kids trying to do homework
- there is only 2GB mobile data for the family each month?
- the device the family uses is 7 years old? the family computer has a virus that means it is so slow? and no one knows how to fix it?
- you only have internet when mum/dad has some spare money
- Your school has a BYOD policy but you don't have a device you can take to school

- Limited internet





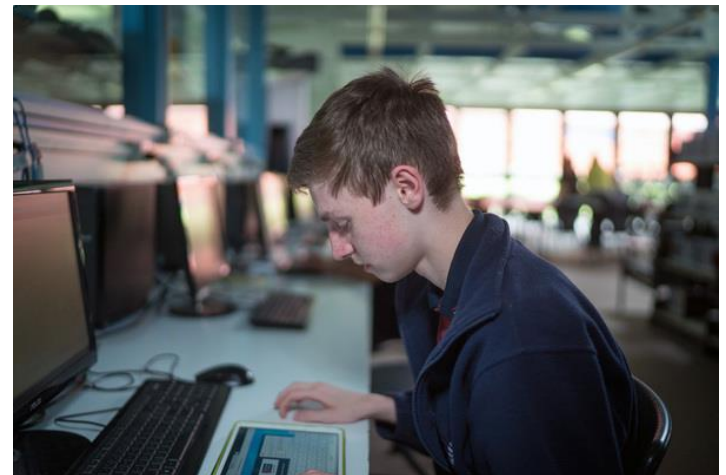

# But this isn't all.....

- [2017 NAP ICT](#) scores, only 25% of low SES year 10 students reached the national digital proficiency level (compared to 66% for high SES).
- 90% of future jobs will require digital literacy skills
- Yet often disadvantaged students are not being prepared for the jobs of the future



# Young people told us



- *“You can’t do anything without the internet”*
- Mobile phone, computer and internet access at home essential esp phone
- Computer and internet supports engagement in school and learning
- Not having them can impact engagement and well being
- Many without home internet relied on free WiFi in local community
