

# Community Celebration Walk with VIEW



**Sunday**

**7 September 2025**

**10.30 sharp from the Grand Staircase Brisbane  
Convention and Exhibition Centre (BCEC)**

We will be guided by Members of Brisbane VIEW Clubs and representatives from the Brisbane Greeters.

Join us and see the best of what Brisbane City has to offer. We will walk through the beautiful parklands of Southbank with impressive views of Brisbane City across the Brisbane River. We will then walk through both the newest and some of the oldest parts of the City.

Cross the Neville Bonner Pedestrian Bridge and head through the Queens Wharf Star Casino Precinct, both opened on the 29<sup>th</sup> August 2024. These are new world class facilities that have placed Brisbane on the map as a tourism, leisure and entertainment destination.

We will pass the heritage listed Commissariat Store, considered to be the birthplace of Queensland. Built in 1828 by convict labour for the Moreton Bay Penal Colony it is the second oldest surviving building in Queensland. We will pass the Queen Victoria Statue as we walk through Queens Park before making our way past the Treasury Building. We will conclude our walk in City Hall Square in front of the Brisbane City Hall.

For those walkers who do not want to walk back to Southbank, buses are available from near the City Hall.

## Directions for Walk

- Leave front stairs of the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre and turn **LEFT** down **GLENELG STREET**
- Cross straight ahead at intersection of Stanley and Grey Street into Little Stanley Street
- Take the path to the **GRAND ARBOUR** in **SOUTHBANK PARKLANDS** and turn **RIGHT** and walk under the Arbour towards **STREETS BEACH**
- Turn **RIGHT** to follow the Grand Arbour Walk to the **EPICURIOUS GARDEN**
- Continue to **CLEM JONES PROMENADE**, turn **LEFT** and walk along the river passing the **RIVERSIDE GREEN PLAYGROUND**
- Turn **LEFT** at the Rivercat Terminal into the **RAINFOREST WALK**
- You will reach **THE NEPALESE PEACE PAGODA**, turn **LEFT** and walk along the Cultural Forecourt until you reach the **BRISBANE SIGN**
- Return to the **WHEEL OF BRISBANE** where you will see the entry ramps to the **NEVILLE BONNER BRIDGE**. Cross the bridge
- Walk straight across the forecourt of Queen Wharf precinct until you find a lift down to the street level of **NORTH QUAY** (stairs available to the left)
- Turn **LEFT** and walk along the Quay until you pass the **COMMISSARIAT STORE** one of Brisbane's oldest buildings
- Cross the road and walk diagonally through **QUEENS PARKS** passing the statue of Queen Victoria
- At the corner of **GEORGE AND ELIZABETH STREET** Cross the road and walk straight ahead pass the **TREASURY CASINO**
- Proceed down the **QUEEN STREET MALL**
- Turn **LEFT** at **ALBERT STREET** at this point and proceed down Albert Street towards the Brisbane **CITY HALL SQUARE**. We will meet all other walkers here

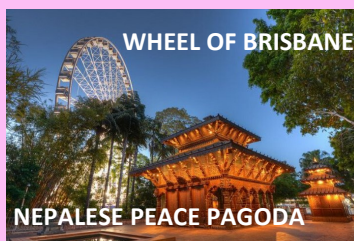
