Annual Walkathon

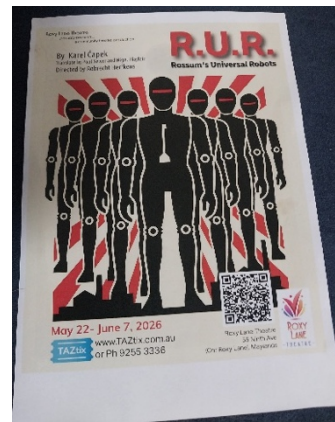
