"One thing I would like to reiterate is how VIEW Club members can donate their unused wi-fi to several worthwhile causes, usually for kids one of which is VIEW Club. Optus put fees up but also wi-fi which is often more than people need. I monitor during the month as you can't leave it all to the end of the month. Home internet doesn't apply.

Optus website is handy for information or go to Optus shop. When you know how, it is easy. Maybe a member already donates their data.

Imagine if all Australia's VIEW Club's donated their unused data."

Here is an excerpt from the webpage:

Many Australians are being left behind, simply because they don't have regular access to the internet. But with partners like The Smith Family, Good360 and KARI Foundation, we're working to change this and you can help.

With an eligible mobile plan, you can donate some of your data.

People in need get a Prepaid SIM with data plus unlimited calls and text every 35 days. Every month, your data donations are pooled and then distributed as an added data boost to help power Australia's potential.
