

On **Thursday 15th May** we met for our Mother's Day meeting at Tonic by the Bay where we welcomed 12 new guests. Everyone was inspired by the stories of member Margaret Paterson and her legendary mother Maud Stanley who talked about their pioneering work with Riding for the Disabled and the value of volunteering. Liz MacLeay provided an update on her communications with our student, which included a lot of really good exclamation marks, and members were thrilled to learn we will soon start sponsoring our second child. Fresh produce at the "Bring and Buy" table was in demand and the chat over lunch was along the lines of "best meeting yet"!



On Thursday 19th June the Busselton VIEW Club met at Tonic by the Bay for a very special general meeting where we hosted a sustainable fashion show in partnership with St Vinnies Our guest speaker, Christine Sambell, the St Vinnies Area Manager, spoke passionately about how last year all money raised by St Vinnies was distributed to over 61,000 disadvantaged people in WA as debt relief, emergency support, rent relief, mental health services, youth support and the list goes on. Did you know that on average each Australian buys 27kg of new clothing / textiles a year and then disposes of 23kg into landfill, equating to 6,000kg of textile waste being dumped into landfill every 10 minutes! What a compelling reason to recycle our unwanted clothing to organisations like St Vinnies when you get the added bonus of helping disadvantaged Australians. After the meeting formalities 6 of our brave members proudly strutted their stuff wearing preloved fashions supplied by St Vinnies Busselton. All attendees, which included over 30 paying guests, had a hoot and the clothes were flying off the racks in the post catwalk sale. As having fun is hungry work some members stayed on at Tonic for lunch and what a buzz there was around the table as the conversation ranged from the fashion show, recycling to mushroom podcasts. We raised over \$400 and 7 new member applications were given out, so all in all a very successful meeting.
