Country clubs combined into zones – seminars held for the first time.

1971 Country clubs combined into Zones and country seminars held for the first time.

National President, Ivy Sweetman represented V.I.E.W. at the Sydney Opera House Opening Ceremonies.

Section B – other organisations, government etc.

1976 Resolution Section A – That representative from clubs be permitted to

attend the annual convention as interested spectators, if space permits.

1977 National President attended the Inaugural Luncheon of the 200th Club. –

Maclean

Minimum age for membership set at 18 years

Observers attended convention but had no voting rights -given the opportunity of learning of the inner workings of VIEW Clubs of Australia.
